Qassim University's fourth campaign "Awareness, Health and Education", which was held at the Qubba Center in Al-Asyah Governorate, over a period of five days, presented 247 diverse programs, benefiting 30341,<> beneficiaries, in various fields of legitimacy, education, medical clinics, dentistry, health and nutrition, in addition to training and skill programs, veterinary clinic, optometry clinic, medical laboratories, radiology, physiotherapy and first aid.

The programs provided by the university to the people of the Qubba Center and its surroundings also included awareness of the harms of drugs and their danger to the individual and society, in addition to recreational and sports programs, where the campaign was supervised and implemented by more than 600 university employees and students, who formed 17 committees and work teams


specialized in the medical, scientific, legal and educational fields, in addition to the organizational and executive committees, where the activities and events of the campaign were distributed to its headquarters in the Celebrations Center in the Qubba Center, boys' and girls' schools, mosques, mosques and government departments.

This campaign comes in its fourth edition, which was held more than 150 km from the university's main headquarters in Buraidah, within the framework of the university's keenness to provide community services to all the people of the Qassim region and reach them in their places, as the university has previously provided three versions of this campaign in several governorates in the Qassim region.

His Excellency Prof. Dr. Abdulrahman bin Hamad Al-Dawood, President of the University, inaugurated on Tuesday morning, 19/10/1444 AH, the initiative of His Royal Highness Prince Dr. Faisal bin Mishaal bin Saud bin Abdulaziz, Governor of Qassim Region, "Qassim Land is Green", in its eleventh phase, and the "Let's Make it Green" initiative, at the headquarters of the University City, in cooperation with the branch of the Ministry of Environment, Water and Agriculture in Qassim and the National Center for Vegetation Cover Development and Combating Desertification.

The inauguration ceremony of the phase was held in the presence of His Excellency the Vice President of the University, Dr. Muhammad bin Abdulrahman Al-Saawi, His Excellency the Vice President for Planning, Development and Quality, Prof. Dr. Khalid bin Bani Al-Harbi, His Excellency Eng. Abdulaziz bin Muhammad Al-Rajaie, Director General of the Ministry of Environment, Water and Agriculture Branch in Qassim Region, and Director of the National Center for Vegetation Development Branch in the region, Eng. Badr bin Abdulrahman Al-Nugaidan, as this campaign aims to plant 30,45 seedlings and 160,70 flowers, in addition to increasing the area of green spaces to more than <>. One thousand square meters, which exceeded <> thousand trees during its previous stages.

For his part, His Excellency the Vice President of the University, Dr. Muhammad Al-Saawi, stressed that the university is completing its march that it began several years ago with its participation in this campaign, pointing out that Qassim is the land of development, the land of goodness and the land of agriculture, and the university can only be part of this fabric, as the university set afforestation as a goal several years ago and is moving towards it with strength and determination to increase the area of green spaces and tree cover in all its locations and branches.

Al-Saawi said: The university city has changed radically during the past years and wore a new green suit, increasing day by day because the results of afforestation need patience and appear after years, and it is hoped that the university - with God's help and success - with the Kingdom's vision 2030 has been decorated with trees throughout it, thanking all the employees of the General Administration of Services and Maintenance working on this project.

The university's participation in this initiative comes out of its interest in developing vegetation cover, and its contribution to protecting the environment and reducing the effects of desertification by planting trees and shrubs suitable for the conditions of the climatic zone, as the university, represented by the General Administration of Services and Maintenance, from the first phase to the tenth stage, planted more than 70 thousand trees, while ensuring the diversity of trees and shrubs between palms, trees and annual flowers, so that the vegetation cover rises to more than 200%.

After that, His Excellency the President of the University planted the seedlings of the launch of the campaign, with the participation of the attendees, and at the end of the ceremony, he honored the branch of the Ministry of Environment, Water and Agriculture in the Qassim region, and the National Center for Vegetation Cover Development and Combating Desertification in the region, for their cooperation with the university in implementing the Qassim Green Land initiative, and the Let's Make It Green initiative.

The University continues its preparations for the conference "The Role of Universities in Activating Vision 2030"

Rector: The conference aims to address the roles and tasks that universities should play to ensure the activation of the objectives of the vision

Information and Communication Center:

The Supreme Organizing Committee of the conference "The Role of Saudi Universities in Activating Vision 2030", to be held at the university headquarters in the middle of next month, continued its preparatory meetings under the chairmanship of His Excellency Prof. Dr. Abdulrahman bin Hamad Al-Daoud, Rector of the University and Chairman of the Supreme Committee of the Conference, in order to determine the readiness of the university and its preparations to receive this major event, which is one of the largest gatherings in the history of Saudi universities, in addition to distributing tasks to the specialized committees emanating from the Supreme Committee.

For his part, the Rector of the University, Al-Daoud, expressed his full confidence in the ability of the University to organize such an important event, stressing that the University has all the human and academic capabilities to bring out the conference in a manner that befits the status of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and its ancient universities.

He added that the conference aims to address the roles and tasks that public and private universities should play to ensure the activation of the objectives of Vision 2030 and its initiative, based on the role that universities should play towards the vision project and its development programs.

For his part, Prof. Dr. Abdullah bin Abdulrahman Al-Baridi, Chairman of the Scientific Committee of the Conference, stressed that the Committee received more than 70 research participations prepared by more than 100 researchers from various universities of the Kingdom, including multiple studies and research that present its vision in how to develop and develop the path of education, scientific research and community service in the Kingdom, which are the main purposes of universities, pointing out that this diversity will have a positive impact in activating the contents of Vision 2030 in the context of university activities, programs and strategic and executive plans.

As for the parties participating in the conference, Al-Baridi pointed out that the number of public and private universities whose participation has been confirmed so far has reached about 18 entities, waiting for this number to increase in the next few days, as well as participation from the Ministry of Education and other ministries, which is an indication of the interaction with this important conference.

Al-Baridi stressed that the Scientific Committee has begun to judge the research contributions submitted to it, and filter them so that the most important and valuable scientific to discuss in the scientific seminars to be held during the conference with the participation of officials in the relevant bodies of the conference topic, and experts in higher education, which will enrich the dialogue and

discussion, and then the recommendations that will be prepared at the end of the conference, and are handed over to the competent authorities in order to activate them in accordance with the approved mechanisms.

Information and Communication Center:

The participants in the conference "The Role of Saudi Universities in Activating Vision 2030" held at Qassim University last week, during the scientific sessions, discussed the results of a number of scientific research on the marketing of university services with the aim of enhancing the financial resources of Saudi universities in the light of Vision 2030 during the session chaired by Prof. Dr. Abdulrahman bin Saleh Al-Wasil, Vice President of Qassim University for Graduate Studies and Scientific Research, where Dr. Ahmed Abdul Fattah Al-Zaki, from King Faisal University, presented a proposal to market university services, including the premises on which it is based. The proposed conception, the parties benefiting from it, the objectives, aspects of the proposed vision, its implementation mechanisms and the mechanisms for its follow-up and evaluation,

Dr. Ali bin Yahya Al Salem, Professor at Imam Muhammad Ibn Saud University, presented a research paper entitled "Developing Proposed Standards for the Attraction, Preparation and Training of Teachers in the Kingdom in the Light of Vision 2030", and the researcher reached a number of

recommendations, the most important of which are: Work to activate the proposed standard specifications to develop the attraction, preparation and training of teachers in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia in the light of Vision 2030 and the development of training and professional programs necessary for their implementation. The inclusion of the educational dimensions included in the educational dimensions included in the Kingdom's Vision 2030, the most important of which are: emphasizing the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia assuming a high leadership position among the countries of the world, highlighting the historical legacy of the Kingdom, developing pride in the national identity, emphasizing moderation, justice and dialogue, and contributing to building a balanced personality capable of initiative and leadership, Emphasize the preservation of public property, promote the efficiency of performance, and contribute to building future leaders.

Dr. Abdulaziz bin Saeed Mohammed Al-Hajri, Professor at King Khalid University, presented a research on the future directions of universities in achieving the Kingdom's Vision 2030, in which he reviewed the strategic objectives of education in light of the national transformation 2020, as well as the objectives of the Ten-Year Development Plan, and the objectives of the Future Plan for Higher Education (AFAC). This resulted in reaching a future vision for King Khalid University in the light of global future trends and building a map of it that includes a brief presentation of each direction, the requirements for its application and the expected result of its achievement.

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
