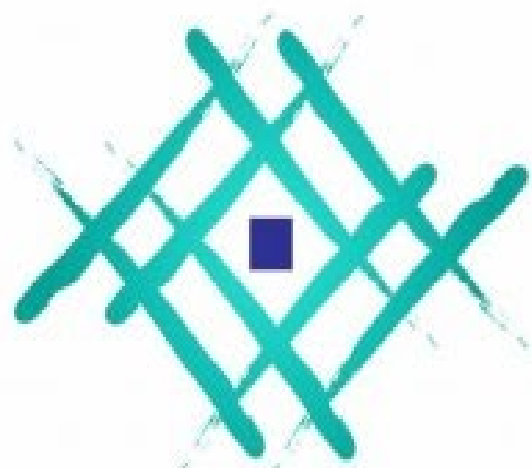

His Excellency Prof. Dr. Abdulrahman bin Hamad Al-Dawood, President of the University, inaugurated on Monday, 18/10/1444 AH, the "Waii 2" exhibition to raise awareness of the harms of drugs, which is organized by the Deanship of Student Affairs, for a period of 3 days, in the presence of His Excellency the Vice President of the University, Dr. Muhammad bin Abdulrahman Al-Saawi, His Excellency the Vice President for Educational Affairs, Dr. Muhammad bin Fahd Al-Sharekh, His Excellency the Vice President for Planning, Development and Quality, Prof. Dr. Khalid bin Bani Al-Harbi, and a number of deans of colleges and deanships, in the main lobby of the university city.



His Excellency the President of the University toured the pillars participating in the exhibition, which aims to familiarize students and visitors with the dangers of drugs, their harms, the negative impact of their use, ways to treat them, and educate them on how to prevent them and avoid falling into their dangers.

The exhibition contains the participation of a number of entities, namely: the Preventive Security Division of Psychotropic Substances at the Ministry of National Guard in Qassim, the Health Cluster in Qassim, the Saudi Charitable Society for the Prevention of Poisons, and Erada Hospital for Mental Health, in addition to the participation of a number of entities within the university, namely: the university's medical city, the College of Pharmacy at the main headquarters, the College of Pharmacy in Unaizah, the Arshadni program, the Guidance and Counseling Department at the Deanship of Student Affairs, and the Student Health Volunteer Club.

The tracks of the "Waa 2" campaign to raise awareness of the danger of drugs also included student exhibitions, awareness campaigns, a number of workshops, in addition to various volunteer initiatives.

The University Launches the Fourth Summer Club

The university, represented by the Deanship of Student Affairs, launched the programs and activities of the fourth summer club, which is held virtually, and lasts for five weeks remotely with the participation of male and female students of all educational levels (primary, intermediate, secondary, and university), where the club's activities aim to achieve the maximum benefit for students and use the summer vacation time with useful and recreational programs and increase digital learning.

The activities of the summer club vary to include six tracks: the skill track, which aims to develop the participants' skills in calligraphy, drawing, photography and some manual skills, the educational track, which aims to add educational experiences to the participants, the technical track, which aims to provide participants with the basics of programming and application making, in addition to the entertainment track, which contains recreational programs and games offered to the club's participants, as well as the competitions track such as the club's general competitions, the "Who is the Martyr" competition, the major cultural competition, as well as the general programs track. Which targets club participants and others.

For his part, the Dean of Student Affairs and Executive Director of the Summer Club, Dr. Muhammad Al-Ajlan, confirmed that the number of registered male and female students in the club is witnessing a significant increase day by day, adding that the work system within the club is divided into a number of groups, each group has a supervisor and a trainer who move between several programs daily accompanied by members, and in at least three rooms through distance learning programs, where activities are divided between young men and women according to ages.

Al-Ajlan explained that the university's belief in its societal role towards activating the energies of all youth groups, whether male or female, resulted in investing these energies during the summer vacation, wishing success and success to the club's members and that its activities and programs would benefit those registered in it from all levels of education.

The University's Veterinary Hospital holds a training course in cooperation with the Camel Club to "Detect Tamper"

To complement the fruitful cooperation between the two sides, the university, represented by the University Veterinary Hospital, in cooperation with the Camel Club, is organizing a training course to detect tampering with camels over a full month, starting from the first of Muharram 1443 AH, at the headquarters of the University Veterinary Hospital in order to raise the efficiency of veterinarians about the different methods in camels and methods of detecting them outwardly and using clinically and laboratory-advanced devices.

For his part, Dr. Abdullah Al-Hawas, Director of the Veterinary Hospital at the University, confirmed that the participants in this course are expected to acquire the ability to familiarize themselves with the different methods used to tamper with camels and different injection places, and they will also have the ability to evaluate them and identify infectious diseases that are similar to tampering with tampering and how to differentiate between them.

Al-Hawas added that the trainee will also learn about the negative effects of hormonal injections and how to detect them, as well as familiarity with how ultrasound works and how to use them in examining healthy tissue and detecting tampering in camels, in addition to learning about the way the thermal camera works, the work of the X-ray machine, and laboratory devices.

The University Holds a Training Course to Raise the Efficiency of Veterinarians in Detecting Tampering in Cooperation with the Camel Club

The university, represented by the University Veterinary Hospital, in cooperation with the Camel Club, launched yesterday, Monday, 1/1/1443 AH, the training course to detect tampering with camels, which lasts for a whole month at the hospital's headquarters, where a number of trainees from different regions of the Kingdom benefit from this course.

This training course aims to raise the efficiency of veterinarians about the different methods of tampering with camels and methods of detecting them outwardly and using clinically and laboratory-advanced devices, as the course discusses several axes, including: the concept of tampering, types of tampering, and objective changes "injection, surgical and mechanical intervention".

Veterinarians are also trained to detect tampering and know the types, methods and methods by which it is done in order to qualify qualified medical cadres to carry out this task to the fullest through the use of modern technology in detecting those practices carried out by some camel owners out of material greed that is incompatible with religion and human ethics, and the trainee is expected after this course to be familiar with these different methods of tampering theoretically and scientifically and is evaluated at the end of the course theoretically and practically.

For his part, the Director of the University Veterinary Hospital, Dr. Abdullah Al-Hawas, explained that this course, which is held in cooperation with the Camel Club and the Department of Veterinary Medicine at the College of Agriculture and Veterinary Medicine at the university, comes within the framework of the interest of our wise leadership, represented by the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques King Salman bin Abdulaziz, and His Highness Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, in raising the efficiency of the sectors responsible for the advancement of this country and combating corruption of all kinds, praising the efforts made by the university represented by His Excellency Prof. Dr. Abdulrahman bin Hamad Al-Dawood. The President of the University and the Vice Rectors of the University to raise the efficiency of medical and other cadres by holding conferences, training courses and workshops in various disciplines.

The University, represented by the Office of Alumni Affairs and Career Development, in cooperation with the Vice Deanship of Human Resources for Career Development, will host on Sunday, 4/3/1443 AH, the "Tuwaiq 1000" camp, which is one of the largest technical camps, as part of the LaunchKSA initiative, launched by the Saudi Federation for Cybersecurity, Programming and Drones and will continue for 4 months as the largest technical launch in the Middle East.



The university's hosting of Tuwaiq 1000 camp stems from its national role and its academic, educational and societal mission to qualify the youth of the country and provide them with the necessary skills and capabilities, and it also comes as an advanced step to invest the human minds of the energies of young men and women to advance the country globally, and achieve the goals of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia's Vision 2030.

The camp, which is hosted by the university and lasts for 3 months and ends with employment, aims to qualify competencies and young cadres of graduates of computer science colleges in the Qassim region in the latest technical fields, where male and female students will be trained on advanced techniques in programming and artificial intelligence at the hands of experts in the Saudi Federation for Cybersecurity, Programming and Drones, in cooperation with Google.

The University, represented by the Sheikh Ali Al-Qarawi Chair for the Qur'an and its Sciences, will hold a remote scientific conference entitled "Modern Studies in the Interpretation of the Qur'anic Text... Medical and healthcare services provided by the university to more than 1200 international students from 90 nationalities

Since the beginning of the outbreak of the Corona pandemic, the university has been keen to provide all health care and subsistence requirements for more than 1200,90 of its international students from <> nationalities, to ensure their safety from this pandemic, as the Deanship of Student Affairs at the university continued to provide these services for nearly four months, including the establishment of health quarries and specialized medical clinics, in cooperation with the university's medical city, the health cluster, and the General Directorate of Health Affairs.

Where the university provided 3 health quarries, 15 medical staff, 8 mobile phones, and 10 volunteer clubs to provide all the needs and requirements of students, in addition to distributing more than 4000 masks, 1000 prayer mats, 5000 gloves, 1800 daily meals, and more than 10.000 sterilization and hygiene tools, and the university's Grants Department booked travel tickets for students wishing to travel, ensure the validity of passports, renew expired passports in coordination with their embassies, and communicate with airlines to travel, to evacuate, ensure residence and extract The visa is for those who want to travel.

The Deanship held a number of meetings with students to identify their needs and provide them with them, where a command and control center was established to manage this crisis, under which 15 committees and mobile clubs in the student housing and a voluntary club to provide all services to these students fall, and daily points of contact were placed between beneficiaries and service providers, to provide all their daily requirements and needs, and allocated an emergency number around the clock, and sought to deport those who want to travel, as it has deported 900 students so far and is continuing deportations after coordination With the relevant authorities, and all preventive measures and precautionary measures were taken according to the instructions received from the competent authorities to confront this crisis and overcome its negative effects.

During the crisis, the university's housing administration provided all the requirements for housing and follow-up maintenance work, and sought to provide the basic requirements for students to bring tools outside the housing, and the roving conducted a daily survey on the external and internal buildings of the wings, through their presence and housing inside the university to provide service around the clock, in addition to following up on about 7 buildings inside the university, following up the process of entry and exit from buildings, and ensuring that there are no infected or suspected cases in some buildings.

For its part, the volunteer club contributed to the delivery of food to each wing within the wings of the buildings, and to provide 3 meals with a total of 1800 meals per day for all students, where the volunteer student provides these meals and places them inside food containers to deliver them to students, according to tabular and accurate models and numbers for each building, wing and room.

The medical administration worked 24 hours a day during the crisis in coordination with the Command and Control Center, to provide treatment and medical consultations for all medical cases, facilitate students' access to the clinic and return to their rooms, dispense treatment and deliver medicines to the beneficiaries, and daily follow-up for all students with continuous examination inside their rooms, in addition to the presence of the Ministry of Health clinic in the student housing.

In turn, the Nutrition Department followed up on securing consecutive meals and closely following them inside the kitchen through specialists to ensure food safety, the number of meals that go out according to a specific schedule for all buildings and the delivery of food.

His Royal Highness Prince Dr. Faisal bin Mishaal bin Saud bin Abdulaziz, Governor of Qassim Region, inaugurated on Tuesday, 17 Rajab 1439 AH, the activities of the "Tenth Career Day", which is hosted by the university over a period of two days, and is the largest gathering of employment in the region, with the participation of 45 government and private agencies that provide their jobs available to job seekers in several engineering, health, administrative, technical and educational disciplines.

The events also include training courses, seminars and meetings presented by a group of specialists in many fields, with the aim of educating graduates professionally, in addition to presenting effective methods in searching for a job and how to prepare a CV and conduct personal interviews.

During his speech at the opening ceremony, His Highness the Emir of the region praised the university's steps and efforts to employ young people, and open the way for families in the evening period, pointing to the high percentage of lack of jobs suffered by the female element, stressing the importance of the steps taken by the state to empower women from jobs and give them more and more opportunity, stressing the success of this forum, which he considers a duty for every university, and any government facility to establish a career day to localize jobs and share the state's efforts in empowering its children. And her daughters from taking over the reins.

His Highness explained that the localization of jobs does not contradict with our respect and appreciation for workers from other countries, who appreciate the state's keenness to enable its young men and women to work, which is the duty of everyone, thanking His Excellency the President of the University, who transferred the university from all scientific and professional fields and community service in the field of projects, organization, restructuring and diversity of its fields, asking God Almighty to the university's employees and all its employees to serve this generous country.

The Emir of the region stressed that the experience in the Emiratization program in the Emirate of the region has proven the existence of key partners, namely the Human Resources Fund, the Chamber of Commerce, the Social Development Bank and the Technical and Vocational Training Corporation, all of whom are partners, pointing to the importance of the training process because the goal of the job seeker who is looking for a job opportunity can only be achieved by qualifying him to take his path in this aspect.

His Highness said: "The efforts of the region, which have always been the first in this field, and no one has any credit for that except for God Almighty, and the cooperation of all, because we really did not succeed in the Emiratization programs in a vacuum, but it was preceded by steps in the aspect of career coordination, self-made youth, and empowering young people from several fields, in addition to the youth committees who were working with us in various festivals."

His Highness stressed on the participating companies the need to adhere to the jobs announced to applicants and bring benefit to them, and not to participate only for the sake of advertising, stressing his follow-up to the recruiters and those who did not fulfill their promise, explaining that the past year witnessed a lot of entities that did not implement what they promised, and therefore each entity offering jobs that it has must adhere to them because the localization of jobs constitutes most of the national, and Emiratization represents the extent of our love for this country.

For his part, His Excellency Prof. Dr. Abdulrahman bin Hamad Al-Dawood, President of the University, said: "The university holds the Career Day this year in a different way, not only based on introducing male and female students to the entities that have employment opportunities, but to introduce them to what our sons and daughters have for their capabilities through the corners of the same market, and this is a step established by the university believing in the skills possessed by the graduates of this university, and also one of the additions on this day is holding training courses in CV writing or in A number of things required by the job that the graduate can find with the exhibitors on this day, in addition to several workshops provided by specialists for our sons and daughters who are graduates and expected to graduate from the university."

In his speech during the opening of the events, Al-Dawood called His Royal Highness Prince Dr. Faisal bin Mishaal the title of "Emiratization Leader", saying: "Because we did not meet in a meeting related to employment or close to this field, His Highness the Amir assured us to search for opportunities for our sons and daughters to engage in business, whether in government or private agencies, and this resulted in the Qassim region being the first among the regions of the Kingdom in the level of Emiratization, and these efforts belong to His Highness the Amir, who is keen to This matter concerns the young men and women of this country and is in line with the vision of our Kingdom 2030."

Al-Daoud announced the establishment of a unit for need and localization, which will offer all the jobs that non-Saudis have for our sons and daughters, and the first batch that will be announced, God willing, will number more than 470 jobs for faculty members in various specialties and the medical city that embraces the university hospital and the dental hospital, which will be opened soon and the first batch will have 50 jobs, and the university must be an initiative by virtue of embracing this day.

Al-Daoud explained that the university has employed more than 244 citizens in various disciplines, including teaching assistant, lecturer, faculty members, technicians, administrators and others, since the establishment of the previous career day until today, noting that after a few days the names of applicants for the position of teaching assistant will be announced, and the university will follow this approach, and God willing, we will soon celebrate the achievement of a high percentage of citizens

who work in the corridors of this university in the educational and technical field, as for administrative jobs, the university has localization by 100%.

Al-Daoud thanked and appreciated His Highness the Emir of the region for his patronage, and everyone who participated and responded to the invitation, whether from government or private agencies, and provided the opportunity for male and female students, and also called on everyone to take advantage of this day and hoped that this day would achieve the goal of reconciling between the job applicant and the employer to serve this country under the leadership of the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques King Salman bin Abdulaziz and His Highness the Crown Prince, may God protect them.
